Michael's Message

"Living on the Edge"

Few of us like change. Change takes us out of our comfort zone - we feel uncertain and perhaps concerned that the normal pattern of our lives will be disturbed. We admit that this is because we feel that we have lost some sense of control.

The other day I was reading a newsletter from two missionaries who work in Lebanon. Their letter referred to the precarious unfenced roads they have to travel and to the fact that many houses are built to the very edge of cliffs. The volatile political climate of surrounding countries also causes them concern.

They say that they "Live on the Edge" but are reminded of Matthew Chapter 6:26-30 which begins:

"Look at the birds of the air: they neither sow nor reap nor gather into barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them" reminding them and us of how much God loves and cares and provides for our needs.



Day after day in the past couple of months the media has presented us with more and more information concerning the uncertain outcome of Brexit. We might indeed have felt that we were "Living on the Edge". We can however recall that though folk have had to live through times of great upheaval, change and indeed

considerable testing, they emerged with the ability to look back on the events with thanksgiving that God has provided for their need.

When we read of the experiences of many well-known Christians we learn that they too had times when they experienced "Living on the Edge". Some also say that when the testing has been greatest and they have had to totally surrender self-reliance but trust God alone, that they have experienced his guidance and support and peace.

So as the days of November unfold we recall Remembrance Sunday and days when our whole nation was "Living on the Edge" in conflict, but thanks to the sacrifice of so many and the guidance of God we emerged to a new and expanded life.

We may indeed experience "Living on the Edge" in future days, but we can also know the care and provision of God in whom we trust.

Great is his Faithfulness.





Delights of Lullington 54: Lullingtonians are everywhere

Potholes aren't all bad. The cavernous, rain-filled one that caused a slow puncture in our car forced me to pay a visit to the cheeriest tyrefitters in Frome. They poured on Fairy liquid, took a look at the bubbles and pointed at a large dent in the wheel hub. After bashing this out with a large hammer and exquisite care, the owner charged me a few quid. "Happens all the time," he said. "All the fault of the bumpy lanes round Lullington," I replied. His face lit up. "Lullington? I was born there!"

It's amazing how often these lightbulb moments occur. On walks, in coffee shops, in pubs, on market stalls, outside my front gate — I'm always meeting folk who were born or brought up here. Many had parents who worked on the Orchardleigh estate, and they recalled childhoods wandering in the park and woods, swimming in the lake, and quivering before the stern moustaches of the squire. Their eyes mist over when they talk of carol singing or the village school or fireworks at the big house.

Just as numerous are the ranks of those who arrived as adults and lived here for a few short years. A lot of them never get Lullington out of their heads. They come back whenever they can, and hang about uncertainly, as if trying to regain a foothold they had lost. Indeed one of these exvillagers refused to admit that she had

left at all, and spent several years as a cuckoo in a string of bemused households. Add to these the dogwalkers, church-goers and sundry other regular visitors and you have a hefty unofficial population.

The joy in the tyre man's eyes was huge and infectious. He seemed to have total recall of his life in the village. He was born in the mill, he said, nearly seventy years ago (seventy? He was trotting round in shorts in the rain). He recited the names of everyone who lived up the lane – the woman in the post office, the old lady in the castle, the school teacher. He even remembered exactly where he went scrumping apples every autumn. Lullington is still deep in there.

We have all had a busy term here at Berkley. Having spent time in the classrooms I have felt a real buzz for learning and everyone's energy has been infectious.

I really love autumn time, we dig out those woolly jumpers, go on welly walks, pick berries, collect conkers and observe the seasonal changes. We share our weekend experiences in our assemblies and talk about the seasons so that children appreciate their natural surroundings.

We will be saying thank you and thinking about our environment at our **Harvest Service**, held at St. Mary's Church. We will also be having a **harvest market** where we will be selling seasonal produce to raise money for Charities. Our Year 4 children will be working at the market, enabling them to practise their mathematical and social skills in a real life context.

This week I have been in school conducting joint lesson and assembly observations with Madeleine. We have, yet again, seen teaching which is universally outstanding and, at times, inspirational with lessons and assemblies ranging from Tutankhamun, maths through computer spreadsheets to Mercy-in-Action, the Lord's Prayer, 17th century London, Ancient Greece, phonics and letter sounds, to shape work and building blocks with shaving foam! A truly varied curriculum but one with clear academic outcomes.

When visiting Springmead I am reminded of something a Professor of Education at Cambridge University once said to a head teacher's conference I attended, "think of a school that makes you long for childhood – and try to make yours that school". Springmead is as near to that dream as I think it is possible to get.


