### Reader's Message

'GLORIOUS THINGS OF THEE ARE SPOKEN'

I write this article some three weeks before the General Flection at the epicentrum of the election debate. It has been a cliché, indeed a truism, to say that our political culture is more divided, more vitriolic, more unpleasant than for many generations: that we have lost the ability to disagree politely with one another. Indeed, the very people who make this point most frequently are often the rudest in political debate just as politicians who complain, justifiably, of the abuse to which they are subjected are often those who are most vitriolic in their criticism of their political opponents.

Political activity, like all human activity, is subject to the law of God, a law of love in which we are commanded to love one another and our neighbours as ourselves. In a redeemed society, a state of society to which we have a duty to aspire, this would be the fundamental nature of human relationships.

It is not surprising, however, that the social and political life of a society which has turned its back on Christianity, that has replaced, as its fundamental values, duties with rights, equality of worth with equality of possessions, self-sacrifice with self-indulgence should decline into squabbling, hatred and mutual accusations of offence.

When this article is published and, it may be, as you read it, the election

will still be in the future, its result uncertain, but we shall have entered the season of Advent.

Advent directs our attention both backwards and forwards. It directs us back to the mystery of the Incarnation of Christ at a particular time in history, to the simple fact that, at Christ's First Coming, God revealed Himself to us as the Creator, the Sustainer and the Redeemer of the world, that He loves us and calls us to transcend the failings, anger and petty squabbles of mankind and to conform ourselves to be the image of the living God.

Advent also directs our attention forwards, away from the uncertainties of the present to the absolute certainty of Christ's return; to His Second Coming when He will judge both the living and the dead, He will bring an end to the material world as we know it, He will inaugurate a glorious new Heaven and a glorious new Earth.





Stan Wilson has become Hall Fire Officer as well as chairing the Fireworks sub-committee and Debs Byrne, Roz Searle, Ian Morris and Pam Portsmouth-Layton have all worked in various capacities to support our activities for which I am very grateful. Sadly Hilary Grist had to retire this year as Secretary and we now share this function between the Committee members and we also lost Sian Chapman and Val New for personal reasons. I am asking all regular users of the Hall to forward representatives to the Committee as we desperately need volunteers to help run what I think most people regard as a valuable village amenity. I have agreed to stay on as Chairman into 2020 but it is really time I stepped down for a more youthful successor.

This year has seen the completion of the painting and renovation of the outside of the buildings. We have also completely overhauled the safety lighting system and installed a new fusebox in the main building. A projector and screen will shortly be added to the Clifford suite and we also hope to have a new radiator fitted before the winter months. We intend to spruce up the Clifford although

major improvements await the outcome of Beckington Cricket Club's proposals for a new pavilion. The Play Area again passed its ROSPA inspection in June although we are well aware of the growing need for a major renewal.

We are pleased that the Fireworks evening is planned to returns this year. The subcommittee has worked very hard to meet the exacting and many demands of Health and Safety and we hope their labours will be rewarded by a good village attendance.

As I said in my opening remarks, I don't think it is always realised how much expensive and time-consuming work is taken up in just keeping the Hall, Play area and Field in good running order. We really need as much support and goodwill we can get from the village to meet these demands.

After watching a fantastic reenactment of David's story and what he achieved when faced with Goliath. we all felt inspired to try and remember we are never alone when faced with a challenge.

Our whole school have a topic that is linked this term to all things icy. Reception class have so far built an igloo outside and have thought about the props they need. They have gathered some key words to go alongside it and I observed some very excited children trying to melt frozen items; some were edible.

In year 1 and 2 the children have made snow globes and written instructions for how to make them, linked to the class text 'The Snowman'. They have been investigating ice and the properties of water by coming up with plans to rescue some toys that got trapped in the freezer! The teachers and the children both enjoyed using a variety of methods and discovered that salt

and warm water freed the toys the quickest from their icy adventure.

Our year 3 and 4 children stepped through the wardrobe doors into a very snowy winter woodland, you guessed it, and they landed in Narnia. Each class is set to make wardrobe doors to fit their book corner and they have started some creative story openers. Mr Banton took the Year 3 children to Liberty Gym in Frome this week: the children were able to use the equipment and lots of fun was had. Next week our Reception children are making reindeer food and the older children will be baking treats to enjoy at our Christmas Fayre which takes place on the 30th November. We will be talking to the children about the types of decorations and presents they can make for loved ones at this time of year.

Within the school we have an FBS (friends of Berkley school) which raises funds for the school to use to enrich the children's time at Berkley. They recently held a disco at school and I was so impressed with the support of parents and the money raised. I am always so grateful to the community for any support given.


I mentioned in a recent assembly that we all need to remember that it takes courage to face each new day and some days it seems really hard but we do it because we are loved and because courage lies within us all.

### **Beckington Parish Council**

### **New Parish Lengthsman:**

The Parish Council has taken its first look at what budget it will need for 2020/21 and therefore what the precept will need to be for the Parish. Nearly all the Council's costs have flatlined, however the Council have resolved to appoint a Parish Lengthsman.

The position of the Lengthsman dates back to the Middle Ages when Parish Councils employed men to maintain an area or length of road. But it began to fall into decline after the late 1880s when road maintenance became the responsibility of County Councils (this is still the case today).

The new Beckington Lengthsman will be employed to serve the whole of the Parish, not just one stretch of road and their remit will go well beyond just sweeping the highways. They will cut, trim, slash, sweep, scrub, wipe, buff, drain and move all manner of things. Helping to keep footpaths open, hedges cut back, ditches kept clear, bus shelters kept clean.

Residents can contact the Parish Clerk with suggestion of jobs that need doing. It should be noted that work will only be carried out on publicly owned land or on public footpaths.

The employment of a Lengthsman will add about £11 per year to the tax bill of a band D property. Members felt that difference in having this resource available to the Parish was worth the small increase.

### Safe Cycling Initiative:

The Parish Council has been exploring the possibility of putting on a safe cycle training event for adult cyclists. This would look at the best ways a cyclist can keep themselves safe when using the highways to get about. Any resident interested in attending this free event should contact the Clerk. No times or dates yet but it would be useful to know if there is any interest.

#### **Grit Bins:**

Somerset County Council have announced they will fill up any empty grit bins this Winter. What they won't be doing is driving around looking for empty ones. Empty grit bins can be reported to: <a href="mailto:countyroads-mendip@somerset.gov.uk">countyroads-mendip@somerset.gov.uk</a>. As with so many things now, the onus is being put on to residents to report rather than things happing automatically.
