Letter from the Right Reverend Peter Hancock, Bishop of Bath and Wells For Parish Newsletters – May 2020

A time to 'Love our neighbours as ourselves'

I wonder - are you someone who gets everything ready long before you need to; jobs done well before time; and someone who is never late for anything? Or are you someone who leaves things to the last minute; works right up to the deadline; and catches the bus or train with moments to spare? Or maybe you are somewhere in the middle?

One of the things that Bishop Ruth and I enjoy doing is writing these articles each month for parish magazines and newsletters. It gives us a chance to keep in touch with people across the diocese and to share the things that are in our hearts and minds as the year unfolds. The only drawback is that we have to write these articles well in advance, so that they reach magazine editors and church administrators in good time. The problem is of course that things may change in all sorts of ways between us writing them and you reading them. I am particularly conscious of that this month, as we are in the midst of the Coronavirus pandemic. Things are changing very fast and it is hard to know what the next few weeks will bring. That inevitably brings with it a certain degree of uncertainty and some us, especially those who are isolated and

cut off, may be feeling anxious for ourselves or for others.

My hope throughout this time of 'lockdown' is that although some of us may have felt physically isolated from each other, that we have not felt socially or spiritually isolated. Indeed, I have been truly amazed and encouraged by all the stories I have heard of people caring for each other, phoning each other and going shopping for those who cannot get out to buy the food they need. At this stage none of us knows guite how and when this virus will eventually be brought under control. However, I do hope that when we get to the stage that restrictions can be safely lifted and we begin to go out and shop as we did before, that things will be different. Many of us have had difficulty buying the food we wanted. Some of us have had to rely on others for our daily needs. We have had to learn new ways to pray and keep in touch with others in our churches and communities. We have had to trust, hope, and look out for our neighbours, especially those who are particularly vulnerable. We have been humbled by the courage and dedication of those who work in the NHS and care homes and all who as 'key workers' have worked tirelessly to look after and provide for us.

Jesus taught us to

'Love the Lord our God with all our heart, with all our soul, and with all our mind' and 'to love our neighbours as ourselves'.

My hope and prayer is that as we emerge from this pandemic that we

and our communities may be a more compassionate, more generous, more grateful. And may we all have discovered what it is to know in a deeper way the peace and the presence of God.

May the peace and the joy of the Risen Lord be with you

Somerset's new Coronavirus

helpline launched

A single phone number is now available for anyone in Somerset who needs Coronavirus-related support from their councils.

The number, 0300 790 6275, is now live and will make it easier for people access any local authority help they may need, including emotional support, in the current crisis.

It links together the district and county council contact centres and will be operating seven days a week, 8am to 6pm, making it the one number you need to remember for Coronavirusrelated enquiries. The district and county councils usual phone numbers will be running as normal alongside the new number for non-Coronavirus related issues.

The new number won't cover medical advice, for which people will need to continue to use the 111 NHS online service and only ring 111 if they cannot get help online.

Anyone who can't find help within their own local networks and volunteers, can use the new number to get help and advice around:

- Personal care and support including food and delivery of prescriptions
- Support for the homeless
- Emotional support if you're feeling worried or anxious
- Transport to medical appointments
- Waste collection and disposal

remotely and onsite.

I am incredibly grateful for their support and receptiveness to the changes we have put in place. This month it is our 18th birthday, our celebrations which were planned for church and school have taken on a different feel, but as you would expect from a school that lives up to its maxim of 'seize the day' we celebrated remotely with flourish and joy!

We remain steadfast in keeping our children's best interests at heart and we will continue to grow and adapt as necessary until things return to a new normal. In the meantime we are doing all we can to keep our children, staff and families' safe, well and supported.

Freshford Surgery Update

The Somerset Primary Care Commissioning Committee met on 13 January 2020 to consider the application made by Beckington Family Practice to close the branch surgery premises at Younghusband House in Freshford.

> The application to permanently close the old premises was approved at the Committee meeting, with the Committee recognising the building's unsuitability for ongoing use as a surgery and accepting the decision made by the Practice to temporarily close the branch surgery in March 2018 when it became apparent that they could no longer operate there safely.

On 10 March 2020, the Committee considered an application from the Practice to open a new branch surgery at Freshford Village Hall. The application was discussed in detail and, following a vote by the Committee, the application was declined. The desire and commitment of the local community for a branch surgery was noted, but on careful examination of multiple relevant factors, such as patient impact, health inequalities, stability and viability of **Beckington Family Practice, alignment** with Somerset CCG Commissioning and Estates Strategy and the proposed premises terms and conditions the Committee concluded that the proposed branch would not be sustainable.

This means that the Freshford branch surgery will permanently close and the Practice will no longer operate a branch surgery in Freshford. Dr John Beaven, Senior Partner, Beckington Family Practice, said:

"We know that this will come as a disappointment to many people. We would like to thank the Younghusband Trust for allowing us to operate from Younghusband House for so many years. We would also like to thank the Freshford Village Hall Redevelopment Committee, who worked with us over the last 7 years to develop an attractive proposal to operate a new surgery from the village hall site. Regrettably trends in funding, governance and GP recruitment mean that in the last two years the proposal has moved being viable to not being sustainable.

"We continue to offer all of our services from our Beckington and Fromefield sites and intend to continue the medication ordering and collection service at The Galleries, with their kind consent."

Parish Council Meetings

It will come as no surprise that the Parish Council didn't have a formal inperson meeting in April. Members did however have an informal chat on Zoom (Online video). The Government have temporally changed the law on how local government meetings must be conducted and it is now lawful to hold remote meetings, so Councillors may opt to do this over the next few months if something comes along that a decision needs to be made on.

On the Parish Council website, you will find links to the latest COVID news and a list of local volunteers who are offing to do shopping or pick up prescriptions. You will also find all the latest news and planning applications.

Planning Applications:

This is one area of Local Government that hasn't stopped, if anything it is speeding up at a time when it is going to be harder for us to all engage with the planning system. All planning applications registered with Mendip District Council are listed on the Parish Council website, so it is worth keeping an eye on this as we have already seen an unwelcome return of a previous application that was rightly turned down by the District Council, the fear is there could be more speculative applications come. It is unlikely that there will be an Annual Parrish Meeting this year, however I am not sure this will be a big loss to most residents, last year it was attended by 2 parishioners and in the three years before that zero attendances.

Footpaths / Rights of Way:

Landowners are responsible for the maintenance of the public rights of way that cross their land, including the upkeep of stiles and gates. It is possible to report defective gates / stiles or overgrown footpaths to Somerset County Council online, but if you could let me know as well then we can do our best to monitor the issue and try and get it resolved.

For a quick starter I have shown a map of the sky looking South at about 10.30 (BST) in the middle of May. It is useful to get to know a few key constellations. In the map two of the most prominent constellations are the Kite shaped Boötes with the bright star Arcturus and the constellation of Leo the Lion with the bright star Regulus. The constellation of Leo is one of the few whose shape bears some resemblance to its name. Arcturus is the 4th brightest star in the night sky.

Progress on Beckington Drainage Review

Key Highlights

• Many of the older dwellings in the village have water wells within their grounds (some up to 12 metres deep). Inspecting these, we found that ground water levels were well below the surface, indicating low risk for ground water flooding.

• Most of the older properties in the village have downpipes that discharge rainwater straight onto the road via small surface grills. These discharge into the highway drainage system via the highway drains.

• All existing highway gullies were thoroughly cleaned during the survey works.

• Culverted watercourses are generally in good condition with some minor stone/slab movement in places (only one partial collapse noted on Goose Street).

• The culverts carry a substantial amount of woody debris from upstream rural areas, making some parts of the system difficult to survey. Improvements to ditch maintenance and using trash screens upstream of the culverts (where open ditches drain into the system), could help to prevent woody debris and leaves from entering the culvert.
