Council Tax:

While witing this in mid-February, it is being reported that Somerset County Council (SCC) is going for a 4.99% increase and Mendip District Council (MDC) a 2.99% increase from April. The Parish Council has voted to freeze the Parish Council part of the council tax bill, but unfortunately as the SCC & MDC part of the bill is far greater than the Parish Council share, residents should be braced for an overall increase.

Allotments Waiting List Open:

Finally, the legal agreement for the transfer of the allotment land is in place and so it is now possible to open up the allotment waiting list. The Beckington Allotment Association manage the waiting list, they can be contacted by email:

To be on the waiting list you must be a resident of the Parish of Beckington. At this time, it is just not possible to say how long you would be on the list before an allotment becomes free but it is likely to be years. However, registering your interest is useful to the Parish Council as an indicator as to how much more land is required to cater for demand.

People With An Interest In Planning Sought:

Most will be aware that the Parish Council scrutinise every planning application that is made in the Parish. The Parish Council also pay an interest in Mendip District Council's planning policy and responding to all consultations.

The Parish Council now requires some help in this area due to a leading member of the council leaving the area and therefore has an impending retirement from the Council. You may have the time to carryout site visits, scrutinise planning apps or read understand and be able to translate local planning policy. You would not necessarily have to become a member of the Parish Council, but it would be useful if you could attend the monthly meetings (Second Tuesday of the month). Please email:






Beckington Astronomical Society (BAS)

Most of the star maps we find printed in magazines (for UK observers) show the view looking South and the majority of Amateur astronomers' observatories have their telescopes set up to have a clear view of the Southern horizon. There is a good reason for this. The Earth's axis, i.e., a line through the poles points almost exactly to the Pole Star. This is not labelled in the map but it is right in



the centre of the page and in the constellation of Ursa Minor. Where the lines converge at the top of the page is the Zenith - a point directly above the observer. As the Earth rotates, the stars appear to rotate about the pole star, and you may have seen time exposures of the night sky showing circles around the pole star. The tilt of the Earth and our latitude means that many of the constellations we see in the lower part of the Southern night sky will never appear in the Northern night sky, but many of those in this Northern night sky map will, in 6 months' time, be well

placed in the South. Having said all that, I thought I would show a map of the Northern night sky for the middle of March. As mentioned, the pole star Polaris is right in the centre of the map and you can see how well the 'pointer' stars of Ursa Major (The Plough, Big Dipper) can act as a pointer to the pole star and the geographical North (it is accurate to within one degree).

We are lucky in the Northern Hemisphere as in the Southern Hemisphere they do not have an easy way to find due South. Mars is just in view in the left of the map but not quite as bright as some of the brightest stars, so not so easy to find. It was nice to hear today (19/2/21) that the Mars lander had been successful. A bit below Mars are the Pleiades or seven sisters: this is a lovely cluster of bright bluish stars than are usually highlighted as a winter object to view. The Andromeda Galaxy can be seen in the left-hand part of the map and again this is best viewed in the Autumn when it is almost directly overhead. If you put a point of a compass (for drawing circles) on the pole star and the pencil point on a chosen star or galaxy vou can draw its movement round the pole star (note all the rest of the sky similarly rotates). It is always worth taking a look to the North.

Let's hope it will not be too long before the society can resume its meetings.

People in the Parish

This month, Network has been speaking with...... **Jon White** who has many happy memories and connections with Beckington and the surrounding villages.

Although I've never lived in the village, Beckington has been part of my life for many years. Probably my first memory is of lay preachers from the Baptist Chapel coming to speak at the Frome church and giving the traditional 'children's' address' to us little ones.

I grew up in the Baptist community of East Somerset and West Wiltshire and can remember the stories I was told of the links between all the local Baptist churches going way back into the 18th Century.

In my teenage years, I can remember when the main road still ran through the middle of the village and I would regularly cycle through on my way to Trowbridge or on cycle runs out through the villages of Beckington, Lullington, Laverton and through Orchardleigh Park. We also used to come to the village hall which was a popular venue for discos in the early 80's when I was at Frome College.

I moved away from the area for Uni but returned to Frome with a young family in my mid-20's, first working at the Woolpack pub and Frome Sports centre before beginning my career in education at Critchill school in Frome. In my teacher training I did my first placement at Beckington village school and can remember Christmas play rehearsals in the Village Hall and taking the class the stone's throw over to the church for worship.

Over the years I have enjoyed playing the organ in the Baptist church and, on a few occasions, the much grander organ in St George's and once, the magnificent one at Berkley! I have kept up links with the Baptist Church, and in normal times, playing for the Crib Service on Christmas Eve has always been the thing that has started Christmas off properly.

I now live and work 'over the border' in Wiltshire and I am part of Oasis church in Bath, but I really value the links I have with Beckington Baptist Church, and in the latest lockdown it has been great to be able to join with St George's on a Sunday morning through Zoom.

Baptists in Beckington over the years

With the excitement of the group of Baptist Christians who moved from a house in Church Hill around 1786, their life became based on the site of the building that bears that date. There had been Baptists active in the villages for a number of years prior to this, certainly from 1692, when a Mr. Randall of Beckington left a sum of money to Badcox Lane church in Frome.

Beckington Baptist church was founded in October 1786 by fourteen members, who were baptised at Frome by the minister of Sheppards Barton Church. The list of family names, have over the years been associated with local Baptist churches in Beckington, Frome, Bratton, Southwick Trowbridge, and Rode. Those listed as founding members of the Beckington Baptist Church were John Alford, William Bailey (who had provided access to the site by sale to the group of land that he had bought) Anthony Bourne. Samuel Nash, Richard Keevil, Harry, Joseph, and Betty Timsbury; Ann Moss; Joseph Thresher: Sarah Abbot: Martha and Elizabeth Carter: Sarah Hillman, and Betty Payne.

Many of these family names occur on tombstones in the parish and folk will recognise some of the surnames as being those of locals to this day; others will be called to mind by older residents. The building in which the founding members gathered was however

not the present building. The one in 1786 was smaller it had cost £307 to build and was licensed as a Dissenters Meeting House on 20th September 1788. The first pastor of the group was John Alford, one of the founding members. John pastored there until 1795 by which time the church had grown to 46 members. He was replaced by a Mr. Hilton a cloth manufacturer from Bradford on Avon. He would ride over each Sunday morning and back after the afternoon service, to serve the church. He did this without pay for some twenty years. It is recorded that this was a person whose 'soul burned for the Lord and was full of love for Jesus and for his fellow men and women.' His ministry was to be very fruitful.

In 1802 the church attendance had grown to such an extent that the building had to be extended; this marked the construction of the present building, By the time Mr. Hinton retired in 1815, the church had grown to some 215 folk. Mr. Hilton served the church faithfully and during his ministry the church was able to help many of the poor in the community, and to serve the village in other ways.

We now look forward to again renewing ways of continuing service to the Lord and to the community when the restrictions of the Pandemic allow. (234 years and still going).

Mental health ideas for uncertain times

We may all have rather mixed feelings on reaching March this year. On the one hand, it is lovely to see the onset of Spring, and vaccinations and better weather may make handling the pandemic a little easier. On the other hand. marking a year from the start of the first UK lockdown will be painful for some, especially as many of us are likely to be experiencing restrictions or ongoing hardships for quite some time. We may need to find new ways to keep going, so here are some suggestions that draw on both science and Christian theology.

Getting outside

Time outdoors in a natural environment is very good for you – and you can't argue with the happy hormones produced by exercise. Attending to the details of nature can also inspire awe, which has been linked to positive mood, and increased life satisfaction. Enjoying creation can also help us connect with God, our Creator.

Looking outside

If you are truly stuck indoors, try putting bird feeders outside your window so creation comes to you. This is also an act of kindness (see below)!

Lament and praise

The Psalms are a rich resource to help us express both our grief and our thanks to God. Try reading one or two each day.

Journaling

Keep a journal of thoughts, experiences or practices you have engaged with during the day. Constructing a personal narrative or story is now recognised as a very powerful psychological and spiritual tool for building resilience. It is also a vital learning tool that we can go back to when tough times return in the future.

Acts of kindness

Helping or encouraging someone else is obviously a good thing to do in itself, but it also has a very positive effect on the giver - spiritually, mentally, emotionally, and even physically. Whichever way you look at it, finding new ways to show kindness to others can be a very effective way to help ourselves feel better too.

Gratitude

Gratitude is another natural drug, in a sense that it can help us feel better. Try keeping a grateful diary, adding a few things each day.

Laugh, sing, make music, dance All of these activities are deeply rooted in our physical and mental makeup. You may have forgotten how great they feel, especially in times of sadness, but we can learn from children who do them very naturally.

I hope these ideas may help bring us closer to God, each other, and His creation.


The coronavirus continues to have a devastating effect on Marie Curie's fundraising, as activities up and down the country have had to be cancelled.





Mothering Sunday 14th March 2021

The Fourth Sunday in Lent was called 'Mid-Lent' or 'Refreshment Sunday', when the rigors of Lent were relaxed more than was normal for a feast day. It is called Mothering Sunday as a reference to the Epistle reading for the Day (Galatians 4:21-31). The Lenten Epistles follow from each other with teaching about our life as Christians and how we are to follow Christ, On Mid-Lent Sunday. the Epistle talks of bondage and freedom; the bondage of the Law and the Old Covenant as compared to the freedom in Christ, "the promised one", and the New Covenant, Verse 26 reads

"But Jerusalem which is above is free, which is the mother of us all."

We gain our freedom from Christ and, as it was seen before the Reformation, the Church. Thus, Mothering Sunday is about the freedom that we gain through the promise of Jesus Christ delivered through our Mother the Church. People were encouraged to go to their 'Mother Church' (their home church or their home Cathedral) to worship and give thanks. Hence apprentices, and others, went home for the weekend and often brought gifts (or accumulated pay) home to their family.

Palm Sunday 28th March 2021

The events of Easter took place over a week, traditionally called Passion Week.

It began on Palm Sunday. After all His teaching and healing, Jesus had built a following. On the Sunday before He was to die, Jesus and His followers arrived at Jerusalem. The city was crowded. Jewish people were arriving to celebrate Passover. This commemorates how they had escaped from slavery in Egypt nearly 1,500 year earlier.

Jesus rode into the city on a young donkey. He was greeted like a conquering hero. Cheering crowds waved palm branches in tribute. He was hailed as the Messiah who had come to re-establish a Jewish kingdom.

The next day they returned to Jerusalem. Jesus went to the temple, the epicentre of the Jewish faith, and confronted the moneychangers and merchants who were ripping off the people. He overturned their tables and accused them of being thieves. The religious authorities were alarmed and feared how He was stirring up the crowds.

On the Tuesday, they challenged Jesus, questioning His authority. He answered by challenging and condemning their hypocrisy. Later

that day Jesus spoke to His disciples about future times. He warned them about fake religious leaders; the coming destruction of Jerusalem; wars, earthquakes and famines;

and how His followers would face persecution. By midweek the Jewish religious leaders and elders were so angry with Jesus that they began plotting to arrest and kill Him. One of Jesus' disciples, Judas, went to the chief priests and agreed to betray Him to them.

Jesus and the 12 disciples gathered on the Thursday evening to celebrate the Passover meal. This is known as the Last Supper. During the evening, Jesus broke bread and shared it with his disciples to represent his body, and shared a cup of wine to represent his blood. Christians still celebrate this in the Holy Communion.

Judas then left to meet the other plotters. Jesus continued to teach the others and then went outside into an olive grove to pray. He even prayed for all future believers. He agonised over what was to come but chose the way of obedience. The Bible says in Luke ch22 v42

"Father if you are willing, take this cup from me; yet not my will but yours be done".

Minutes later Judas arrived with soldiers and the chief priests and Jesus was arrested.

In this month, when we especially think about mothers, we thank you for the families and friends you have given us. You know how hard it has been to have been separated over these past months, how much we have missed and longed for their hugs, their physical presence and fellowship. 
